- The above listed Problem Animal Control Agent(PAC)/State Licensed Trapper is the only person authorized to remove beavers from the specific location listed above and can only trap beavers using permissible trap
 All traps must be registered with MassWildlife. Relocation of beavers is not permitted.
- 2. Emergency Certification is valid for ten days from the date of this approval. Two ten-day emergency permit extensions can be applied for using this same form. A 30-day extension permit is obtained from the Department of Fish and Wildlife.
- 3. The Permit/Emergency Certification authorizes the applicant to use Conibear or box or cage-type traps subject to Department of Fish and Wildlife regulation.
- 4. Any additional alterations beyond that necessary to abate the immediate public health threat (such as full breaching of a beaver dam or the installation of water leveling devices) will require the filing of a Notice of Intent with the DEC in accordance with the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act.
- 5. If this is a chronic problem site, the Applicant will need to work with MassWildlife and the DEC to develop a long-term plan to solve the beaver problem using water-flow devices and non-lethal methods where feasible.
