COVID-19 Update for Devens: May 5, 2020

Mandatory face covering order in effect: While the stay at home advisory remains in effect, if

you must go outside for any reason, as of May 6, 2020, the Governor is requiring all persons over the age of 2 in a

place open to the public (indoors or outdoors) to wear a mask or cloth face covering. Full details of the order are at: https://bit.ly/35yTrff. Remember, this is NOT a replacement for social distancing so please continue to stay at least 6 feet apart from others and do not congregate in groups. Learn how to make your own face covering at the CDC website. If you need masks, the Nashoba Associated Boards of Health has free

Non-compliance with the Governor's order could result in a civil penalty of up to \$300 so for everyone's health and safety, if you have to go out, please ensure you wear a mask.

Contact Tracing: Persons testing positive for COVID-19 will receive a call from the MA COVID Team to provide you with support and to help identify those you have had close contact with to help stop the spread. These calls will come from a number with a 833 or 857 area code, so please answer.
