

COVID-19 Vaccination Update: February 2, 2021



Vaccine Update for Massachusetts: The Administration announced updates to Phase Two of the distribution plan, which will begin February 1st for the first priority group. Individuals 75 and older will now be the first priority group in Phase Two. Consistent with CDC guidance, individuals 65 and older and individuals with 2 or more comorbidities will now be the second priority group in Phase 2. The exact date of eligibility will depend on the vaccine supply from the federal government.

How to Get a Vaccine:

Individuals with questions about how to get a vaccine should follow these steps:

1. Visit www.mass.gov/COVIDvaccine to find your phase and priority group;
2. If you are eligible: use www.mass.gov/COVIDVaccineMap to find a vaccine clinic near you;
3. Make an appointment online and fill out the attestation form.


ALL SITES REQUIRE APPOINTMENTS.

Local eligible residents 75 and older can also contact their town's Council on Aging for assistance or booking. Please remember, the vaccine supply remains extremely constrained in Massachusetts and nationally, resulting in a limited availability of appointments. Current eligible residents may have to wait several weeks for an appointment.

The State's COVID-19 Response Command Center continues to work with health care providers, local officials, pharmacies and others to set up additional COVID-19 vaccination sites across the Commonwealth, with a focus on accessibility and geographic equity. By mid-February, the Administration expects there will be 165 publicly available vaccination sites. The Administration will announce further updates on timing for other priority groups as the Commonwealth gets more information on vaccine shipments from the federal government.
