

COVID-19 Update for Devens: July 29, 2021



Everyone Should Mask-Up When Indoors and Unable to Socially Distance:

The Nashoba Associated Boards of Health has recently seen an increase in the number of cases in their member towns, which includes Devens. A majority of the new cases are people that have not been vaccinated. **At this time we are recommending that individuals wear masks inside where they cannot be socially distant. This added level of protection will help protect you, your loved ones, and those around you.** If you are a business owner, please continue to encourage staff to get vaccinated. If you have come into contact with someone that has COVID-19 you do not need to quarantine if you are vaccinated but you should monitor for symptoms and need to quarantine if you develop symptoms or test positive.



Face Covering Requirements Still in Effect for Unvaccinated People and in Certain Locations:

Effective May 29, 2021, all unvaccinated residents must continue to wear masks in indoor settings and when they can't socially distance. masks are still required for both vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals at all times on public transportation and rideshares, healthcare facilities, and certain facilities that house vulnerable populations.
