

COVID-19 Update for Devens: March 22, 2020

As of 12:00pm on March 22, 2020, there are no known reported cases of COVID-19 within the Devens Regional Enterprise Zone (Devens). Today, the Town of Ayer Board of Health received confirmation from the MA Department of Public Health that an Ayer resident is the second person in MA to die from a COVID-19 related illness. The resident did have pre-existing condition making them more susceptible to the disease. Our thoughts are with the family and friends of this resident.
