





COVID-19 Update for Devens: May 20, 2020

Reopening Phase 1 Begins: As of May 18, 2020, essential services have been expanded and authorized to continue operating under specific self-certification requirements. All businesses must meet these requirements before reopening and have until May 25, 2020 to comply with these mandatory safety standards. **The state has created guidance and templates to make this re-opening process as safe and efficient as possible.** Full details at: <https://www.mass.gov/info-details/reopening-massachusetts>
